Mandarin Training Center (MTC) was established in 1956 as an extension of National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU), and has since been the largest leading institution dedicated to the teaching of Chinese as a second language.

With students from over 80 different countries of diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds, MTC creates an environment where fellow students must communicate and foster friendships with each other in the common language here—Chinese. Seasonal Program



MTC's main program design is the Seasonal Program. The program operates on a quarterly basis; each term is 3 months long. In addition, a 2-month Summer Session, from July to August, is also available.

The program is suitable for learners who want to study Chinese intensively for 3 months or longer, or even for 2 months in summer. There are always more than one thousand students studying Chinese language in MTC,

so classes are available to learners of all levels, from beginners to advanced learners. Hanyu Pinyin is used for introducing pronunciation of characters. Listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills are all emphasized to build a solid foundation for participants' Chinese language proficiency.

Other Fees

- 1 Registration Fee (for first-time students or students who have not registered for more than one year): NT\$ 2,500

Refund Policy

- BEFORE the term begins, students may apply for a 90% refund of the tuition fees.
- 50% will be refunded for applications submitted before 1/3 of the classes for the terms in which the student enrolled are completed. No refunds will be given for applications submitted after the classes for the terms in which the student enrolled are 1/3 completed.
- It takes 7-10 working days to process the refunds.

- (2) A Photocopy of the cover page which shows the account holder's name and the inside page which shows the closing balance of your bank account passbook.
- (3) If referring to a family member's bank statement, the family member must submit a letter that guarantees to support financially the applicant's stay in Taiwan. Admission

- -MTC will send e-files of the admission letters to applicants after reviewing the application materials and accepting the application.
- -The admission letter is required for visa application. Applicants who need visitor visas should submit their applications as early as possible to allow sufficient time for visa application. - -The admission letter lists the program period, the dates for the registration and placement test, and tuition fees. Please read it closely.

Registration & Tuition Payment

- -After completing the application process and receiving the admission letter, student should register in person on the registration day (see pp.21-22). Student who fail to complete the registration process and placement test on the new student registration days will be charged a late registration fee regardless of their payment status.

1 Tuition Payment:

2 Placement Test:

Students are given a placement test and then placed in classes suitable for their levels. Students are assigned in classes according to class time availability as well.

3 Student ID Card Pick-up:

Students will receive a student ID card after completing registration process.

Late Registration

Students can still register and take a placement test after the new student registration days. However, there will be an additional registration fee of NT\$1,000 for those who register late.

Please note that students who register on time will be given first priority to class options and availabilities. MTC cannot guarantee those who register late will be placed in their preferred class.

Orientation & Class Schedule

MTC will hold an orientation session for new students the day before the class begins. The orientation will explain the MTC courses and relevant campus regulations, as well as the procedures and regulations for applying for visa extension and residence permits. You can also log into MyMTC to check the dates.

Extracurricular Activities

MTC organizes a wide variety of activities, including language contests, Dragon Boat Racing, and cultural excursions (half/full day) to provide students with abundant opportunities to practice Chinese and learn about Taiwan's culture.

Important Notice

(1) Prepare sufficient funds in advance:

The first month's stipend shall be wired around the middle of the second month (e.g. Scholarship recipients of the Fall Term shall receive their September stipends around October 15). Therefore, scholarship students have to prepare adequate funds to cover tuition fees and living expenses prior to arrival.

(2) Estimated cost of study for one term:

In Taipei, living costs are about NT\$20,000 to NT\$30,000 per month, including the rent. In addition, you need to pay a two-month deposit. Before arrival, MTC recommends that you prepare enough to cover tuition and living expenses for your 3-month stay.



CLASS LEVELS & LEARNING OBJECTIVES

MTC classes are divided into 16 terms, and are compatible with ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) and CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). New students are given placement tests to be placed in classes most suitable to their level. The required number of terms for completing each level is a rough estimate based on curriculum plans of MTC's regular classes. Students enrolling in more intensive programs (such as intensive classes or one-on-one classes) will progress faster.

Insurance

Following regulations from the MOE, all foreign students shall purchase COVID-19-related medical insurance and carry it with them upon arrival. The group insurance for MTC students covers hospitalized stays caused by illness or injury, not including medical treatment. Students with ARC for at least six months and have stayed in the country for six months (without leaving the country more than once) may apply for National Health Insurance (NHI)



- 3. Walk along Heping East Road to the east for 10 minutes. MTC is located at no. 129 Heping East Road



Frequently-Asked Questions

Visa

Do I need to apply for a visa? What type of visa should I apply?

If you plan to enroll in MTC's seasonal program for one term or longer, you need to apply for a visitor visa for language study (visitor visa of FR code). Please note that visitor visas can only be applied overseas and cannot be applied in Taiwan.

How do I apply for a visitor visa of FR code?

You should apply and present your MTC admission letter to the nearest ROC embassy, consulate, or representative agency for a visitor visa of FR type. Admission letters are valid only for the term applied for. Please contact the embassies or consulates nearest to you (http://www.taiwanembassy.org) for other required documents for visa application.

How long can I stay on a visitor visa of FR type?

Visas of FR type usually allow holders to remain in Taiwan for 60 days. Extendable visas may be extended for a maximum stay of up to 180 days. If your visas are non-extendable or no further extensions are granted, you must leave Taiwan to obtain a new visa.

I didn't enter Taiwan on a visitor visa of FR type. Can I change the type of visitor visa I hold after I register in the MTC?

No, you cannot change the type of visa or the purpose of stay in Taiwan. You must leave Taiwan to apply for a visa of FR type.

My country is on the list of 90-days visa exempt countries. Can I come to study at MTC without applying for a visa?

Due to the border control measures of the Taiwan Ministry of Foreign Affairs, foreigners who are eligible for visa-free entry or holder of visitor/resident visas must have relevant documents in order to be eligible for exempt status. These documents must be presented to National Immigration Service (NIA) personnel at the port of entry for approval. Holders of Special Entry Permit from the Republic of China. (Taiwan) embassies and consulates stationed abroad, or of valid alien residence cards or ID cards, can enter after being checked by NIA personnel.

Attention: As visa-exempt entry is not extendable, we recommend that you obtain an extendable visa before departing for Taiwan.

I want to study for 3 terms or more. Can I stay longer without having to leave the country?

After four months of consecutive study, students in good academic standing may apply for a resident visa to continue with their Chinese study. With a resident visa, they may apply for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) later. Please note that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs sometimes requires a guarantor before a resident visa can be issued. MTC does not act as a guarantor for any student.



Accommodation

1 Does MTC provide a dormitory for students?

MTC does not provide a dormitory for students. Students usually stay in a hostel for a few days and look for long-term accommodation.

2 Will MTC help me find accommodation?

Please turn to p.13 or visit the MTC website ("Students/ Accommodation") for the list of recommended temporary stays.

3 How much does the average rent cost in Taipei?

The rent depends on the type of room you rent (separate room or suite) and the area. The rent in Taipei is about NTD 10,000 to NTD 15,000 per month. In addition, you usually need to pay a two-month deposit when signing up for the lease.
