Mandarin Training Center (MTC) was established in 1956 as an extension of National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU), and has since been the largest leading institution dedicated to the teaching of Chinese as a second language.

With students from over 80 different countries of diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds, MTC creates an environment where fellow students must communicate and foster friendships with each other in the common language here—Chinese. Whatever your reasons for studying Chinese and whatever your initial levels are, MTC will help you make rapid progress during your time with us.

Seasonal Program



MTC's main program design is the Seasonal Program. The program operates on a quarterly basis; each term is 3 months long. In addition, a 2-month Summer Session, from July to August, is also available.

The program is suitable for learners who want to study Chinese intensively for 3 months or longer, or even for 2 months in summer. There are always

more than one thousand students studying Chinese language in MTC, so classes are available to learners of all levels, from beginners to advanced learners. Hanyu Pinyin is used for introducing pronunciation of characters. Listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills are all emphasized to build a solid foundation for participants' Chinese language proficiency.

NOTE For Class B to open, the minimum number of student per class is 13. In the case where there are not enough students of the same level to open a class, our system will move the students to the same time frame for Class A. Those students who are switched from Class B to Class A or from Regular to Intensive have to make up the difference of tuition before the end of class change period.

Other Fees

- Administration Fee NT\$1,000 and Registration Fee NT\$1,500 for new students and returning students.
 ** Administration Fee is required to pay when submitting the application online.
 **There will be an additional registration fee of NT\$1,000 for those who pay the tuition after the on-site registration day.
- Mandatory Accidental Insurance: around NT\$ 350 (for three months)/ NT\$ 235 (for two months)
 ** It is compulsory for foreign students to be enrolled in MTC mandatory accidental insurance plan.
- Estimated costs for study materials: around NT\$ 2,000 per term

NOTE: Administration Fee, Registration Fee and Mandatory Accidental Insurance Fee are not refundable.

Refund Policy

- Before the term begins, students may apply for a 90% refund of the tuition fees.
- 50% will be refunded for applications submitted before 1/3 of the classes for the terms in which the student enrolled are completed. No refunds will be given for applications submitted after the classes for the terms in which the student enrolled are 1/3 completed.
- It takes 7-10 working days to process the refunds.
- Only tuition fees will be refunded. Miscellaneous fees will not be refunded.

| Required Documents

1 One photocopy of a high school diploma or above

Please provide official proof of graduation from your school; No translation or authentication is required; Students unable to submit a diploma may submit a university transcript instead.

2 A photocopy of your passport information page

3 Financial Statement

Following Taiwan MOE and immigration agency regulations, please provide the financial proof for your admission letter and application for Chinese study visas.

(1) A formal bank statement with your name shown, issued and dated within 3 months, with adequate funds of the equivalence of at least US\$2,500.

or (2) A Photocopy of the cover page which shows the account holder's name and the inside page which shows the closing balance of your bank account passbook.

If using a family member's bank statement, the family member must submit a letter that guarantees to support financially the applicant's stay in Taiwan. Please have the letter signed and upload it as an additional document to the application system.

For MOFA scholarship applicants, in place of a financial statement, please kindly have a letter of guarantee signed. Please note that HES or other scholarship applications must provide a valid financial statement and cannot use the MOFA guarantor letter.

Bring the application materials to Office 709 on the 7th Fl. of Bo-ai Building. See p.18 for direction of MTC.

| Admission

-MTC will review the application materials and email the admission letter in 7 working days.

-The admission letter is required for visa application. Applicants who need visitor visas should submit their applications as early as possible to allow sufficient time for visa application. Please write an email to us if you need a hard copy of the admission letter. For information on visa requirements, please see p.19.

-The admission letter lists the program period, the dates for the registration and placement test, and tuition fees.

-A NT 1,000 administration fee is required to complete the application. Please follow the steps and pay the fee at the online application portal.



| Registration & Tuition Payment

After receiving the admission letter, students should undergo the online registration procedures, including taking online placement tests, selecting and receiving assigned class schedules, and paying the full tuition fees online during the designated period.

Students who are not able to complete the necessary procedures during the online registration period can come to MTC on the on-site registration day, around 1 week prior to the school starting. You can find the on-site registration date and other important information on the admission letter.

The Registration Procedure:

1 Placement Test:

Students are given a placement test and then placed in classes suitable for their levels. Students are assigned in classes according to class time availability as well.

2 Tuition Payment:

Please complete the payment within 5 working days after receiving the course arrangement notification. If you pay tuition after the on-site registration date, you will be required to pay a late registration fee NTD1,000.

You may choose one of the following ways to make tuition payment. Please note that the MTC office does not accept tuition payment in cash.

A. Online Credit/Debit Card Payment

Please find the payment link on the course arrangement notification sent from MTC by email.

B. Pay at Convenience Stores or Banks

If you are in Taiwan, you may choose to pay by cash at convenience stores or banks with printed billing statement from the payment link on the course arrangement notification.

C. Credit/Debit Card Payment On-site

It's acceptable to pay by physical credit/debit card(Visa/Master/JCB) at MTC office.

3 Student ID Card Pick-up:

Students will receive a student ID card after completing registration process.

| Late Registration

1 After the on-site registration day, a late registration fee of NT\$1,000 will be applied, and students may not receive the preferred class time or level.

2 Late on-site registration period is until the first day of school. After the first day of school, no late registration is accepted.

| Orientation

MTC will hold an orientation session for new students before the class begins. The orientation will explain the MTC courses and relevant campus regulations, as well as the procedures and regulations for applying for visa extension and residence permits.

Semester Program

MTC offers the Semester Program with a flexible class schedule for international degree students who plan to study at NTNU for at least one semester and wish to improve Mandarin Chinese during their stay. This program also welcomes non-degree students and any adults who to join the class. The program is 12 weeks long.

| Bachelor Programs:

The Bachelor's Program in Learning Sciences focuses on interdisciplinary research in learning technology, data science, and informatics. The curriculum is designed with modular structures, consisting of a standard core module and specialized modules (Learning Technology Module and Informatics Module). It balances theoretical and practical aspects to equip students with professional knowledge in the field of learning sciences.

The Bachelor's Program in the College of Education follows the "Interdisciplinary X International" theme, offering courses entirely in English. It aims to cultivate innovative leaders in international education and provides specialized subfields, including digital and cultural innovation, health and well-being, and human resource and career planning.

| Master Programs:

The Master's Program in the Department of Education provides a diverse curriculum structure, including Educational Philosophy and History, and Sociology of Education. It also offers a fully English-taught course list to assist students in planning their studies.

Important Notice

(1) Prepare sufficient funds in advance:

The first month's stipend shall be wired around the middle of the second month (e.g. Scholarship recipients of the Fall Term shall receive their September stipends around October 15). Therefore, scholarship students have to prepare adequate funds to cover tuition fees and living expenses prior to arrival.

(2) Estimated cost of study for one term:

In Taipei, living costs are about NT\$20,000 to NT\$30,000 per month, including the rent. In addition, you need to pay a two-month deposit. Before arrival, MTC recommends that you prepare enough to cover tuition and living expenses for your 3-month stay.

(3) Taiwan Visa and Residency Requirements:

Scholarship recipients must process the necessary visa and procedures in accordance with the scholarship regulations. Failure to comply will affect their eligibility for the scholarship.



CLASS LEVELS & TEACHING MATERIALS

MTC classes are divided into 16 terms, and are compatible with ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) and CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). New students are given placement tests to be placed in classes most suitable to their level. The required number of terms for completing each level is a rough estimate based on the curriculum plans of MTC's regular classes. Students enrolling in more intensive programs (such as intensive classes or one-on-one classes) will progress faster.

Pre-Departure Information

Insurance

Before coming to Taiwan, language students should purchase adequate overseas medical insurance in their own country to ensure their health needs in Taiwan. MTC will arrange group accident insurance for students, which covers accidents and does not cover illness or general medical expenses. Students with ARC who have stayed in the country for six months (without leaving the country more than once) must join the National Health Insurance (NHI). Living Costs

In Taipei, tuition excluded living costs, including rent are about NT\$20,000 to NT\$30,000 per month. In addition, you need to pay a two-month deposit. Before arrival, MTC recommends that you prepare enough to cover tuition and living expenses for your 3-month stay.

Taoyuan International Airport is linked to Taipei by buses and Taoyuan Metro. From the airport to Taipei Main Station, the fare is NT\$130~150 (by bus) or NT\$160 (by Metro). From Taipei Main Station, you may take a taxi or MRT to MTC.

By Taxi

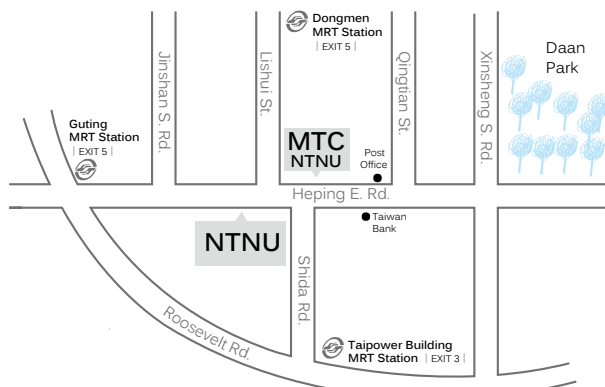


Taxis from Taipei Main Station to MTC cost around NT\$ 200. Please show the taxi driver the MTC's address listed on the right side.

Frequently-Asked Questions

Visa

1 Do I need to apply for a visa? What type of visa should I apply?

We suggest all seasonal program (3 months course) students to apply for a visa for language learning (visa code: FR) at the Taiwan representative office in their region. If you enter visa-free, you are not eligible for visa extensions or government scholarships, such as HES or MOFA.

2 How do I apply for a visitor visa or resident visa of FR code?

To apply for a visa for language learning (visa code: FR), bring your MTC admission letter to the nearest ROC embassy, consulate, or representative agency. The admission letter is valid only for the term for which it was issued. Please contact the nearest embassy or consulate (<http://www.taiwanembassy.org>) for any other required documents for a visa application.

3 How long can I stay on a visitor visa of FR type?

For language learning, ROC consulates typically grant a visitor visa valid for 60 or 90 days with a single entry. (In some countries, you may pay more to apply for a multiple-entry FR visa.) Before your 60- or 90-day visa expires, you can apply for a visa extension in Taiwan up to 180 days provided you submit the necessary documents. If your visa is non-extendable or no further extensions are granted, you must leave Taiwan to obtain a new visa.

4 I didn't enter Taiwan on a visitor visa of FR type. Can I change the type of visitor visa I hold after I register in the MTC?

No, the FR type visa is not available in Taiwan. Please note that a visitor visa of the FR type can only be applied overseas. You must leave Taiwan to apply for it.

5 My country is on the list of 90-days visa exempt countries. Can I come to study at MTC without applying for a visa?

If you plan to study at the MTC less than three months, you can certainly use visa exemption to enter the country. The 90-day visa counts from the next day of your arrival. Please arrange your travel accordingly.

6 I want to study for 3 terms or more. Can I stay longer without having to leave the country?

Visitor visa (code: FR) holders who have studied in the same language school for four months consecutively and have continued to register for more than three months, and whose total absence hours do not exceed 1/4 of the total class hours may change their visa to Alien Resident Certificate (ARC).

Note: all benefits, including visa extension, Alien Resident Certificate (ARC), work permit, and National Health Insurance, are available only to FR visa holders.



Accommodation

1 Does MTC provide a dormitory for students?

MTC does not provide a dormitory for students. Students usually stay in a hostel for a few days and look for long-term accommodation.

2 Will MTC help me find accommodation?

Please turn to p.18 or visit the MTC website ("Students/ Accommodation") for recommended temporary or long-term stays.

3 How much does the average rent cost in Taipei?

The rent depends on your room type (separate room or suite) and the area. The rent in Taipei is about NT\$ 10,000 to NT\$ 15,000 per month. In addition, you usually need to pay a two-month deposit when signing up for the lease.
